- 2566** ☒ 1836 (Aug. 12) entire letter from H.M.S. Dublin at Rio de Janeiro to Wakefield, rated "3/7", with faint green "BRAZIL/F" and Oct. 1 arrival on reverse, interesting contents: *"I expect that the Harrier will go down to the Falkland Islands, they are very barren and the only inhabitants are a Lieutenant and a few seamen, it is very cold down there and fresh beef is the only thing that is yet to be got. If the Harrier is ordered not to go there. Possibly she will be ordered round Cape Horn, if she is I shall most likely go on board again."* Ex Marsden. Photo. **£600-£700**
- 2567** ▲ 1842, a three page autographed letter sheet dated "H.M.K. Arrow, Jan 23rd 1842 Port Edgar Falkland Islands" possibly the earliest recorded letter from West Falkland, written by Captain William Robinson to his mother and brother containing (somewhat prematurely) his last farewells and bequeathing his possessions to them. Also included with this lot are copies of the certificate of service of William Robinson Assistant Paymaster 1879 and appointment to rank of retired Captain in 1860. **£300-£400**

The earliest outward item from the “Travis” Correspondence with interesting comments “I dream so often that I am in England hard at work in the City, when I thoroughly awake am so glad I am in the Falklands. I really should be sorry to leave and hope that the Directors are as well pleased with me - they ought to be for I have done far better than any of my predecessors & am worst paid.” Ex Marsden. With B.P.A. certificate (1985) commenting "*bisect...genuinely used*" but expertised prior to removal of fake surcharge.
