Stephen John Lawrie (1950 – 2019)




Steve was born in East Ham, London. In 1956 the family moved to Ilford, and for the rest of his life Steve lived in the family home near Wanstead Park. He studied architecture at the North East London Polytechnic and did his practical training with Redbridge Council in the early 1970s, before moving into private practice in Soho – a work location that provided easy access to the dealers and auction houses at the centre of the philatelic world. In around 1976 he joined the Woolwich Building Society as an in-house architect. But sadly, at the early age of 32, Steve became seriously ill with rheumatic fever, which caused considerable damage to his heart. A host of other debilitating conditions followed, leading to several near death episodes. Inevitably his professional career was cut short. There was at least a partial compensation: it allowed extra time for his collecting interests. Steve was steadfast in the face of his illnesses and for a long time seemed indestructible.

Steve's interest in telegraph stamps, the philatelic speciality for which he will be best remembered, began in the mid 1960s when he and his twin brother first took a shine to a £1 Post Office Telegraphs colour trial that they had spotted in a backstreet stamp shop behind the British Museum in London. This was his first purchase, from which an obsession developed that lead to a lifetime of dedicated study.

American comic books of the 1950s were amongst Steve's other passions, and he built up an extensive collection. He had a consuming interest in military history; and his architectural training contributed to his becoming a noted expert in the historical fortifications of the First and Second World Wars. Steve conducted extensive research into the construction of the Maginot Line and produced a draft study in preparation for a book which sadly was never published. Steve spent many weeks scouting physical locations and delving into French archives in order to gather a wealth of information which he presented at various international conferences.

Steve is missed greatly by his fellow Telegraph collectors and by all who had the pleasure of meeting him through the years.

The Steve Lawrie Collection of Private Telegraph Companies

The Electric Telegraph Company

This was the largest and most important of the private telegraph companies. Set up initially as the Electric Telegraph Company on Sept. 2 1845 it only became incorporated and began operations after the passing of the Electric Telegraph Company Act of 1846. The head office was initially at 345 Strand although the centre of operations was first at Lothbury and later at Moorgate Street Buildings. In 1855 it amalgamated with the International Telegraph Company to form the Electric & International Telegraph Company. In terms of philatelic significance, this was the first company to produce stamps and stamped stationery, beginning with franked message forms in 1851.

Sir Edward Denny Bacon in his book and paper on the stamps of the Electric Telegraph Company (both 1927) noted that these first message forms were among the greatest of philatelic rarities, having been produced for display at the London Exhibition, held in Hyde Park between May and Oct. 1851. A second issue of forms in 1853 was due to changes in the charge rates and their usage continued until at least the mid 1850s.


Typically the first issue forms show individual control numbers added in black in the upper left corner and are printed on coloured wove paper of approx. 18.5 x 23cm. They are watermarked with the name of the company, bear the signature of the secretary, J. S. Fourdrinier, at left, and were available in values of 1s., 2s.6d. and 5s. The printer is unknown but it was suggested by Langmead as Waterlow & Sons. The second issue is similar but with small changes, the controls now appearing at right and showing the initials of the chairman, John Lewis Ricardo, and the secretary, John S Fourdrinier. The issued values have been stated to comprise a 1s.6d, 2s., 3s. and 4s., however a 1s. value with the second issue layout, control no. 38323, exists in the Royal Philatelic Collection and so should also be included. There exists furthermore a 1s. of intermediate format, control no. 29930, with the secretary's signature only but with the control no. at right. Typically just one or two copies of each value are now known to exist and this collection is likely unique in history in containing an example of all bar one of these forms, a number of which were not known by Bacon and Langmead to have survived.

1855 - 60 Second Series

Very quickly Perkins Bacon were asked to delete the distances on the plates and to insert £sd denominations instead. This became the second issue with 10,000 of each of three values - 1s., 2s. and 2s.6d. - delivered in early 1855. Langmead notes that no stamps were known from this printing other than proof sheets, these providing the only record of this issue. However, the 1s. listed as lot 19 below is now known to have survived. The plates were again altered between 1855 and 1857, the 1s. becoming the 3s. and the 2s.6d. becoming the 1s.6d. New plates were made from the original roller impression for the 3d., 4s. and 1s. plate 2.

Director's Message Franks

During their period of operations the company issued specific stamps for the sole use of the directors. The stamps are imperforate and show the director's name together with the initials of the then current chairman and secretary. Of the six probably issued only three are now available to collectors, those produced for George Parker Bidder, Capt. Huish and Charles William Earl. Of these only single copies are known, with the exception of those for Capt. Huish whose stamps are more common. A couple of other directors are represented in institutional collections.

1861 Continental Service

In 1861 the company produced specific stamps for a service to the Continent, noted by Philbrick and Westoby as having been required to pay the rates to Denmark, Hanover and Hamburg. These were produced by lithography by Waterlow & Sons and show the initials "R.G." and "J.S.F." A few proof examples are known but issued stamps are of the utmost rarity. Of the four values produced only two are known to still exist, mostly in institutional collections.



The Submarine Telegraph Company



"INSTRUMENT-ROOM OF THE SUBMARINE TELEGRAPH COMPANY, AT CORNHILL.

Established in 1850 to operate submarine telegraph cables to the continent, the company worked closely with the British & Irish Magnetic Telegraph Company in its various forms as it did not possess inland cables of its own. After nationalisation of the telegraph network this was the only company to be left in possession of its cables and continued its operations in collaboration with the Post Office. Stamps for the company were first designed and printed by De La Rue in 1861 for three values in limited quantities, a total of just 500 sheets in total, and it is possible two further values were printed early the following year. Almost no examples of the issued stamps have survived with three examples now found in the Royal Philatelic Collection and another two examples in private hands. Die proofs for all values, originating from the De La Rue archive and elsewhere, do survive, although in small numbers.

The British Telegraph Company

Formed in 1853 by Royal Charter amalgamating the British Electric Telegraph Company and the European & American Electric Printing and Telegraph Company, the company operated in this form for less than four years before merging again with the English & Irish Magnetic Telegraph Company. Stamps were issued at some time in the latter half of 1855. Langmead and Hiscocks note two values, the 2s. and 4s., although the company's published rates indicate the need for a 1s.6d stamp which appears below.





The English & Irish Magnetic Telegraph Company

Originally incorporated in 1851 as the Magnetic Telegraph Company, it merged with the British Telegraph Company in 1857 to form the British & Irish Magnetic Telegraph Company. Stamps were printed by Mawdesley & Co, Liverpool, probably as late as 1857 so received little use. Stamps appearing without control nos. are thought to be proofs and are relatively common. Stamps with controls are scarcer but can be found, these probably being remainders, and usually have close margins at top and foot.

The British & Irish Magnetic Telegraph Company



Registered in 1857 as the amalgamation of the British Telegraph Company and the Irish Magnetic Telegraph Company, the head office of this comapny was in the Liverpool Exchange and shared with the Submarine Telegraph Company, the two companies working in close collaboration. Their first issue of stamps appeared in 1857 but Langmead lists these as only known in the Royal Philatelic Collection. A second stamp design was produced in 1859, initially perforated $11\frac{1}{2} \times 12$ and overprinted with black controls, this perforation gauge being rare. Around 1860 the perforation gauge was changed to $13 \times 13\frac{1}{2}$, these stamps being more common. Control nos. were printed in both black and red.

The London District Telegraph Company


This company was established in 1859 to provide cheap telegraphic communications to the capital. Its head office was at 58 Threadneedle St., where it shared with both the Submarine Telegraph Company and the British & Irish Telegraph Company. The three companies worked closely together to provide a comprehensive service to customers. Stamps of three values, 3d., 4d. and 6d., were first issued in 1862 printed on coloured papers, with control nos. and perforated $12\frac{1}{2}$. A new stamp design was issued in 1865, 3d. and 6d. values were printed on surface coloured papers, perforated $11\frac{1}{2}$ and with handwritten control nos. Both values are exceptionally rare with just a handful of each now available to collectors. The new designs were later printed in much greater numbers on coloured papers and with machine printed control nos. in two different sizes.

The United Kingdom Electric Telegraph Company

Established in 1860 with the stated intention to provide a single low uniform rate of charge within the United Kingdom, this company encountered extensive competition from older more established firms and struggled to deliver on its promise. It did however succeed in becoming one of the top two major providers of telegraphic services by the time of nationalisation. Three values of message stamps were produced from late 1861, a 3d., 6d. and 1s., printed by De La Rue, perforated $15\frac{1}{2} \times 15$ and initially in a vertical format. These can be found with and without control nos. in black. The company's choice of printers means that the stamps of this company tend to be of a noticeably superior quality to those of most other private telegraph companies. In 1864 De La Rue engraved new dies for the 6d. and 1s. and the format became horizontal. This was followed in 1865 with a similar layout for the 3d. 1s.6d. and 2s. values.




In 1863 the company issued bonds carrying interest at a rate of $7\frac{1}{2}$ %. However, competition was fierce and in June and Dec. 1864, when payments became due, it became necessary for these to be paid by means of message stamps to the level of the value owed. In order to distinguish these from the standard message stamps an overprint "INT" was added below the control no. 

The Universal Private Telegraph Company

The company was registered in 1860 for the provision of private rented lines to commercial enterprises and private individuals. Whilst reasonably good business in London and many northern cities was achieved it was the company's operation of the West Highland Telegraph that necessitated the production of stamps. These were produced in 1864 by Waterlow & Sons, 6d and 1s. values being known, although there is evidence that a 3d. and 9d. may also have existed. The stamps were printed in sheets of 100 (10 x 10) and perforated $12\frac{1}{2}$. Unused stamps today are relatively common as it is thought that the majority of the stock was remaindered at the time of nationalisation. Numerous minor varieties may be found and each value can be found with a range of different coloured control nos. No used examples have ever come to light.

The South Eastern Railway

In common with other railway companies, the telegraph lines of the South Eastern Railway were available to the public to send telegraphic messages. However, unlike most, the company issued stamps, printed in sheets of 12 or 24 by Charles Whiting and first issued in 1860 for the convenience of the Army at Aldershot, although these were used across their network. The first issue of four values, 1s., 1s.6d., 2s.3d. and 2s.9d. were perforated 9 and are very rare, known examples mostly confined to the Royal Philatelic Collection. In 1862 or early 1863 the perforation gauge was changed to approx. 12 and values of 9d. and 1s.2d. were added. In 1868 the perforation gauge was again changed, this time to approx. $12 \times 12\frac{1}{2}$ for the 1s. and 1s.6d. values. Proofs of all values exist without control numbers but these are exceptionally rare, the 9d. red found perforated, the others imperforate. Again, the majority of these proofs are to be found in the Royal Philatelic Collection.

The General Telegraph Company

A half dozen or so stamps bearing the name of this company are known in unused condition and were considered by Morley in 1893 to be bogus and an utter fabrication. No limited company had been registered in this name, however, a General Telegraph Company of 9 John St., Adelphi, London, run by Francis Wishaw and Nathaniel Holmes, had been active a few years prior to the enactment of the Limited Liability Act of 1855. A connection to the General Private Telegraph Company of Manchester has also been suggested.

Bonelli's Electric Telegraph Company

The Bonelli company was formed in 1861 with the objective of establishing the system of typo-electric telegraphy that had been invented by Chevalier Bonelli, former Director of Telegraphs in Italy. The company's stamps were produced by Waterlow & Sons in 1868 but their use is thought to have been extremely limited, almost all being eventually remaindered. A line between Liverpool and Manchester was in intermittent operation and it is possible that a few stamps were used but none seem to have survived. Unused remainders of the 3d., 6d., 9d. and 1s. lithographed and perforated 12½ with black control no., are relatively common. A variation of the 3d in brown., with slightly larger control panel and roughly perforated was printed in small sheets that were stitched into booklets. A very few of these have survived intact and they are among the earliest known of all stamp booklets.

The National Telephone Company

Incorporated in 1881, The National Telephone Company was not at all as its name first suggests but rather a local company that provided subscriber telephone services in just a handful of cities and towns. The company, however, progressively absorbed other smaller local companies and by the early 1900s controlled most local services. Inter-city trunk lines were operated by the Post Office and the company was obliged to pay a substantial fee to access these. The company was eventually taken over by the Post Office in 1912. Stamps showing a portrait of the chairman, Colonel Raynsford Jackson, were issued in 1884 to account for telephone services provided to non-subscribers, these being affixed to call sheets to the value of the call and cancelled, usually with the rubber stamp of the exchange in a purple ink. These were printed by Maclure, MacDonald & Co. of Glasgow in five denominations, 1d., 3d., 4d., 6d. and 1s., rough perforated 12 and in sheets of twelve.

THE PENNY POSTAGE ACT. (From The Observer.)

In the last number of *The Observer*, it was stated that a deputa-tion from the Stationers and Paper Manufacturers of London had waited upon the Chancellor of the Exchequer, with the view of inducing him to abandon that portion of the Penny Postage plan

waited upon the Chancellor of the Exchequer, with the view of inducing him to abandon that portion of the Penny Postage plan which requires that the money shall be paid in advance, and that it shall be collected by means of stamped envelopes. The pro-posed substitute for this portion of the plan is, that the writers and forwarders of letters shall be allowed to use, for the purposes of writing, what paper they please; and that they shall, as at present, be at liberty either to pay the postage in advance, or leave it to be paid by the parties to whom the k-tters are addressed. Any suggestions, coming from so respectable a body of individuals, are, unquestionably, entitled to grave consideration, and will, there is no doubt receive from the Government of the country that degree of attention to which they lay claim. It may be well, however, before expressing an opinion on this subject, to examine the objections urged by these parties *seriatim*, and see whether they are in reality as formidable as they may at first sight appear. The principal objections then urged by these parties against the use of the stamped envelope are these :--First that the introduc-tion of this plan will establish an extensive and unjust monopoly in the trade:- secondly, that it will inflict an injury upon the stationers and manufacturers by lessening the consumption of paper; and, thirdly, that it will throw embarrassments in the way of a successful trial of the Penny Postage principle itself. First, it is said that the adoption of the stamped envelope, as a means of collecting the Penny Postage, will establish an exten-sive and unjust monopoly in the trade. Now, monopolies in all cases—whether in the hands of private individuals—ought not, except under peculiar circumstances, to be tolerated; and even where circumstances may seem to justify them, they ought not to be tolerated to any greater extent, or for any longer period of time, than their existence or continuance can clearly be shown to be conducive to the public good. The Penny Postage Act, as it now stands, is an untried experiment—an experiment, in some measure, forced upon the Government; and an experiment, which, whether it be viewed in its moral, educational, or commercial bearings, must, if ultimately successful, be of immense advantage to the country. Should it be necessary for the Government, therefore, in order to test the efficacy of this plan, to enter into a contract with a single individual to supply the whole of these envelopes for a given time, the end to be obtained would, in our view, sufficiently justify the means. By the adoption of such a step, no injustice would be inflicted upon any individual, or upon any class of individuals; for this contract, like all other Govern-ment contracts, might be open to the fair competition of the capitalist; and the Government might be left to choose that which, in the exercise of their discretion, would contribute most to the capitalist; and the Government might be left to choose that which, in the exercise of their discretion, would contribute most to the success of the experiment. Should the experiment, however, as we have no doubt, prove a successful one, there is little reason to suppose, and especially in an enterprising country like this, that a monopoly even of this limited kind would be permitted to con-tinue one hour longer than its practical utility could be shown. But, as yet, the intentions of the Government are unknown; and it would be iddne therefore to dwell upon this chicking a greater it would be idle, therefore, to dwell upon this objection at greater length.

As to the second objection --namely, that the adoption of the stamped cavelope would inflict an injury upon trade, by lessening the consumption of paper--it appears to us to have been taken up without sufficient regard to the practical working of the system. If, say the paper-makers and stationers, the stamped enveloper, as it has been suggested by Mr. Hill, be adopted, one-half of the letters being letters of business, and requiring no more than one side, will be written upon the savelopes themselves; enclosures will therefore be rendered unnecessary, and the supply of paper be proportionably decreased. Now, for the sake of argument, we admit that one-half of the letters may be written on the envelopes, but in this we can perceive no grievous infliction upon the trade. To ensure the success of the projected plan of Penny Postage it is calculated, on the lewest scale, that there must be an eightfold increase in the number of letters transmitted; so that, even upon half the letters are written on the envelopes themselves, there will still be a fourfold increase upon the present consumption of paper. But, should the transmission of letters increase in a higher ratio than that of eightfold, which is more than probable, the consumption of paper will be increased in an equal degree. Nor is the pretext that it will repress the ingenuity of the manifecturer, and diminish the variety in the present assortment of paper, entitled to more consideration; for on what conceivable ground can it be imagined, that persons who now exercise their taste as to the materials on which they write, will be debarred its exercise energly because their communications are to be inclosed in a stopped envelope? View the matter, indeed, in whatever light we may, as it regards the consumption of paper, the proposed change, instead of being an infliction upon the trade, can be nothing but a positive and unequivocal good--a good, too, which must necessarily keep pace wi
