Advice on References and Condition

Quotations of catalogue numbers and values are taken from Stanley Gibbons catalogues, and other catalogues named in the text, current at the time of lotting. This auction contains many items that are unique or of exceptional rarity. It should be noted that all philatelic items are graded and described in relation to their condition as normally found. Covers in particular should be expected to have minor imperfections consistent with their age and passage through the postal system and only significant faults will be described. The condition of covers will not be considered as grounds for return.

The illustration of a lot in the catalogue or on the internet is deemed to form part of its description and lots may not be rejected on the grounds of imperfections that are visible clearly from the illustration.

Conditions of Business

Conditions mostly concerning buyers

1 The buyer

The highest bidder shall be the buyer at the 'hammer price' and any dispute shall be settled at the auctioneer's absolute discretion. Every bidder shall be deemed to act as principal unless there is in force a written acknowledgement by Grosvenor that he acts as agent on behalf of a named principal.

2 Minimum increment

The bidding and advances shall be regulated by and at the absolute discretion of the auctioneer.

3 The premium

The buyer shall pay to Grosvenor a premium of 24% on the 'hammer price' inclusive of a sum in lieu of Value Added Tax at the standard rate and agrees that Grosvenor, when acting as agent for the seller, may also receive commission from the seller in accordance with Condition 15.

4 Value Added Tax (VAT)

Lots on which Value Added Tax at 20% is payable by the buyer on the 'hammer price' are indicated in the catalogue with the sign '+' Lots with an 'X' before the lot number have 5% Importation VAT charged on the hammer price because they have been imported into the UK from outside the EU. In such cases Grosvenor has used a temporary importation procedure which in effect means that the point of importation is deferred until the lot has been sold by Grosvenor. At that point the buyer is treated as the importer and is liable to pay the Import VAT due.

5 Payment

Immediately a lot is sold the buyer shall:

- (a) give to Grosvenor his name and address and, if so requested, proof of identity; and
- (b) pay to Grosvenor the 'total amount due' (unless credit terms have been agreed with Grosvenor before the auction).

6 Grosvenor may, at its absolute discretion, agree credit terms with the buyer before an auction under which the buyer will be entitled to take possession of lots purchased up to an agreed amount in value in advance of payment by a determined future date of the 'total amount due'.

7 Any payments by a buyer to Grosvenor may be applied by Grosvenor towards any sums owing from that buyer to Grosvenor on any account whatever without regard to any directions of the buyer or his agent, whether express or implied.

8 Collection of purchases

The ownership of the lot purchased shall not pass to the buyer until he has made payment in full to Grosvenor of the 'total amount due'.

9 (a) The buyer shall at his own expense take away the lot purchased not later than 5 working days after the day of the auction but (unless credit terms have been agreed in accordance with Condition 7) not before payment to Grosvenor of the 'total amount due'.

(b) The buyer shall be responsible for any removal, storage and insurance charges on any lot not taken away within 5 working days of the day of the auction.

(c) The packing and handling of purchased lots by Grosvenor staff is undertaken solely as a courtesy to clients and, in the case of

fragile articles, will be undertaken only at Grosvenor's discretion. In no event will Grosvenor be liable for damage to glass or frames, regardless of the cause.

10 Buyer's responsibility for Lots purchased

The buyer will be responsible for loss or damage to lots purchased from the time of collection or the expiry of 5 working days after the day of the auction, whichever is the sooner, and neither Grosvenor nor its servants or agents shall thereafter be responsible for any loss or damage of any kind, whether caused by negligence or otherwise, while any lot is in its custody or under its control.

11 Remedies for non-payment or failure to collect

If any lot is not paid for in full and taken away in accordance with Conditions 6 and 10, or if there is any other breach of either of those Conditions, Grosvenor as agent of the seller shall, at its absolute discretion and without prejudice to any other rights it may have, be entitled to exercise one or more of the following rights and remedies:

- (a) to proceed against the buyer for damages for breach of contract.
- (b) to rescind the sale of that or any other lots
- (c) to re-sell the lot or cause it to be re-sold by public auction or private sale and the defaulting buyer shall pay to Grosvenor any resulting deficiency in the 'total amount due' after deduction of any part payment and addition of re-sale costs and any surplus shall belong to the seller.
- (d) to remove, store and insure the lot at the expense of the defaulting buyer and, in the case of storage, either at Grosvenor premises or elsewhere.
- (e) to charge interest at a rate not exceeding 1.5% per month on the 'total amount due' to the extent it remains unpaid for more than 5 working days after the day of the auction.
- (f) to retain that or any other lot sold to the same buyer at the sale or any other auction and release it only after payment of the 'total amount due'.
- (g) to reject or ignore any bids made by or on behalf of the defaulting buyer at any future auctions or obtaining a deposit before accepting any bids in future.
- (h) to apply any proceeds of sale then due or at any time thereafter becoming due to the defaulting buyer towards settlement of the 'total amount due' and to exercise a lien on any property of the defaulting buyer which is in Grosvenor's possession for any purpose.

12 Liability of Grosvenor and sellers

- (a) Each lot is sold as:
 - (i) *Genuine* unless otherwise described in the sale catalogue.
 - (ii) *Correctly described* (see also clause 12 (f)). The date of any certificate forming part of the description of any lot will be included in the description.
- (b) A purchaser shall be at liberty to reject any lot if he:
 - (i) within 7 days gives the auctioneer written notice of intention to question the genuineness of or, as the case may be, the accuracy of the description of the lot and/or requests the submission of the lot to a recognised expert or expert committee in accordance with the Grosvenor expertising policy separately stated.
 - (ii) proves that the lot is not genuine or was incorrectly described; and
 - (iii) returns to the auctioneer within 30 days of the date of the sale,

the lot in the same condition as it was at the time of the sale; provided that the auctioneer may, at his absolute discretion, on receiving a request in writing from the purchaser, extend for a reasonable period of time the return of the lot, to enable it to be submitted to an agreed expert or expert committee.

nb: The onus of proving a lot not to be genuine, or incorrectly described, is on the purchaser. The inability of a recognised expert or expert committee to express a definite opinion shall serve to discharge the onus on the purchaser and shall be a ground for rejecting the lot concerned.

(c) Where a lot has been submitted for an expert opinion, all costs for such an option shall be paid for by the person who retains the item or items to which the opinion relates.

(d) Where the purchaser of a lot discharges the onus and acts in accordance with sub clause (b) of this clause, the auctioneer shall rescind the sale and repay to the purchaser the purchase money paid by him in respect of the lot.

(e) No lot shall be rejected if, subsequent to the sale, it has been immersed in water, marked by an expert or expert committee, or treated by any other process, unless the auctioneer's permission to subject the lot to such a process has first been obtained in writing.

(f) Any lots listed under 'Collections and Various' or stated to comprise or contain a collection, issues or stamps, which are undescribed, shall be put up for sale, not subject to rejection, and shall be taken by the purchaser with all (if any) faults, lack of genuineness, and errors of description, and numbers of stamps within the lot, and the purchaser shall have no right to reject the lot; except that, notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this sub clause, where before the sale a person intending to bid at the sale gives notice in writing to, and satisfies the auctioneer, that any such lot contains any item or items not described in the sale catalogue, and that person specifically describes such in that notice, then that item or items shall, as between the auctioneer and that person, be taken to form part of the description of the lot for purposes of sub clauses (a), (b) and (d) of this clause.

(g) No lot illustrated in the catalogue shall be rejected on the grounds of cancellation, centring, margins, perforation or other characteristics apparent from the illustration. Catalogue illustrations are not guaranteed for tone or colour and no lot shall be rejected on the ground of inaccurate reproduction. Imperfections on covers shall not constitute grounds for return unless of an exceptional nature.

13 Grosvenor sells as agent for the seller (except where it is stated wholly or partly to own any lot as principal) and as such is not responsible for any default by seller or buyer.

14 Any representation or statement by Grosvenor, in any catalogue as to authorship, attribution, genuineness, origin, date, age, provenance, condition or estimated selling price is a statement of opinion only. Every person interested should exercise and rely on his own judgment as to such matters and neither Grosvenor nor its servants or agents are responsible for the correctness of such opinions.

15 Whilst the interests of prospective buyers are best served by attendance at the auction, Grosvenor will, if so instructed, execute bids on their behalf, neither Grosvenor nor its servants or agents being responsible for any neglect or default in doing so or for failing to do so.

16 Grosvenor shall have the right, at its discretion, to refuse admission to its premises or attendance at its auctions by any person.

17 Grosvenor has absolute discretion without giving any reason to refuse any bid, to divide any lot, to combine any two or more lots, to withdraw any lot from the auction and in case of dispute to put up any lot for auction again.

18 (a) Any indemnity under these Conditions shall extend to all actions, proceedings costs, expenses, claims and demands whatever incurred or suffered by the person entitled to the benefit of the indemnity.

(b) Grosvenor declares itself to be a trustee for its relevant servants and agents of the benefit of every indemnity under these Conditions to the extent that such indemnity is expressed to be for the benefit of its servants and agents.

19 Any notice by Grosvenor to a seller, consignor, prospective bidder or buyer may be given by first class mail or airmail and if so given shall be deemed to have been duly received by the addressee 48 hours after posting.

20 These Conditions shall be governed by and construed in accordance with English law. All transactions to which these Conditions apply and all matters connected therewith shall also be governed by English law. Grosvenor hereby submits to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts and all other parties concerned hereby submit to the non-exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts.

General conditions and definitions

1 In these Conditions:

(a) 'catalogue' includes any advertisement, brochure, estimate, price list and other publication.

(b) 'hammer price' means the price at which a lot is knocked down by the auctioneer to the buyer.

(c) 'total amount due' means the 'hammer price' in respect of the lot sold together with any premium, Value Added Tax chargeable and additional charges and expenses due from a defaulting buyer in pounds sterling;

(d) 'deliberate forgery' means an imitation made with the intention of deceiving as to authorship, origin, date, age, period, culture or source which is not shown to be such in the description in the catalogue and which at the date of the sale had a value materially less than it would have had if it had been in accordance with that description.

(e) 'sale proceeds' means the net amount due to the seller being the 'hammer price' of the lot sold less commission at the 'stated rates' and 'expenses' and any other amounts due to Grosvenor by the seller in whatever capacity and howsoever arising.

(f) 'stated rate' means Grosvenor published rates of commission for the time being and a sum in lieu of Value Added Tax thereon.

(g) 'expenses' in relation to the sale of any lot means Grosvenor charges and expenses for insurance, illustrations, special advertising, packing and freight of that lot and any Value Added Tax thereon.

(h) 'bought-in price' means 5 per cent more than the highest bid received below the reserve.

2 Vendor's commission on sales

A commission of 15% is payable by the vendor on the hammer price on lots sold, unless otherwise agreed.

3 VAT

Commission, illustrations, insurance and advertising are subject to VAT at the standard rate where appropriate.

Important Information for Buyers

Absentee bids

If instructed we will execute bids and advise intending purchasers. No charge is made for this service. Lots will always be bought as cheaply as is allowed by such other bids and reserves as are on our books. In the event of identical bids, the earliest received will take precedence. Always indicate a 'top limit' – the amount to which you would bid if you were attending the auction yourself. 'Buy' or unlimited bids will not be accepted. **All bids must be confirmed in writing or by fax prior to the date of the sale.**

Bidding slip

Further advice to bidders and purchasers may be found on the bidding slip included with this catalogue. Please use this slip when sending bids to us. **It is vital that the slip should be signed.**

Buyer's premium

A buyer's premium of 24% on the hammer price, inclusive of an amount in lieu of VAT, is payable by the buyer on all lots.

In such cases Grosvenor has used a temporary importation procedure which in effect means that the point of importation is deferred until the lot has been sold by Grosvenor. Pre-sale estimates

Please include your name and invoice number with your instruction to the bank. If paying by this method from overseas an additional amount (minimum £6) should be added to cover the bank charges that will be incurred, otherwise your total balance due may not be cleared.

Clearance of purchases

It is regretted that Grosvenor cannot take Banker's references over the telephone at the time of clearance and that buyers cannot take possession of their purchases until cheques are cleared.

If buyers wish to pay for their purchases by cheque they are urged to arrange clearance of their cheques well in advance of the sale by supplying appropriate banker's references.

In the case of cheques drawn on foreign banks, £12 must be added to the invoice total, otherwise such cheques will be returned.

Live Online Bidding

Grosvenor offers clients the opportunity to bid in real time during our live auctions from anywhere in the world. Using this service allows bidders flexibility and total control over bidding. - The reason for the extension request must be stated. Requests relating to condition only will not normally be approved.
- Extension requests will not be granted for any lot already accompanied by a recent certificate of authenticity, except by special permission.
- The sale of any lot identified in its description as having 'faults', 'defects' or 'imperfections' will not be cancelled in the event of these being specified individually on the issued certificate.
- Lots will be submitted directly to the nominated expert or expert committee by Grosvenor, unless otherwise agreed.

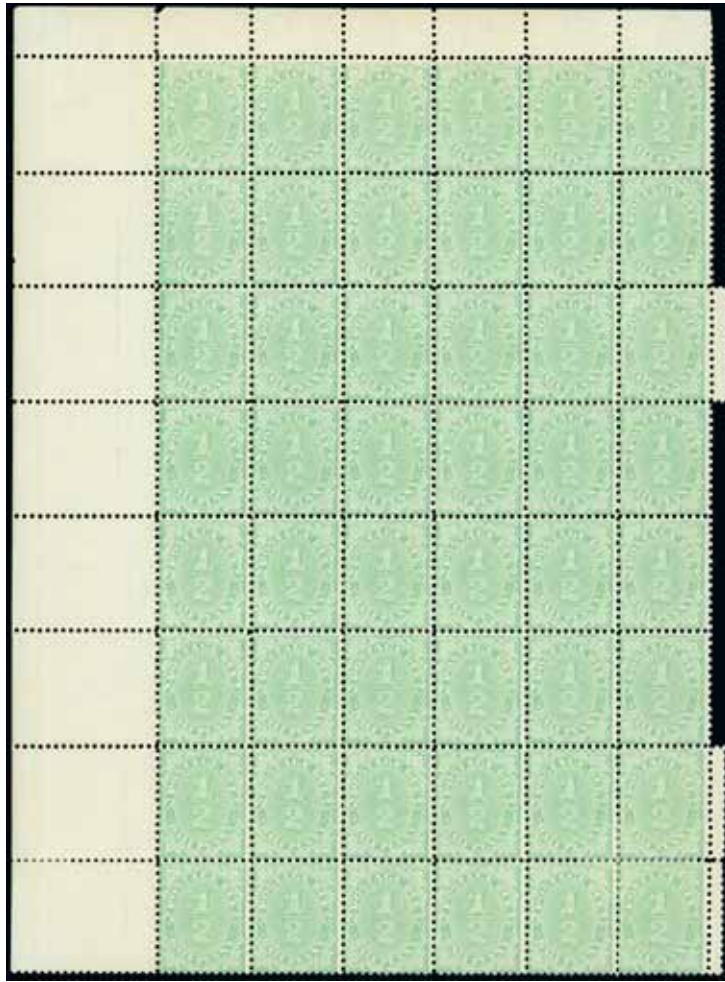

A weekend meeting takes place annually in March during which displays are given, auctions and a bourse take place and an Annual General Meeting is held. Regional meetings are also held on a regular basis in various parts of the UK and in other countries, including the USA, Norway, Sweden and

the Falkland Islands. Members, whether beginners or advanced collectors, are encouraged to attend.

The award winning *Upland Goose*, a quarterly journal, is distributed to all members and to leading philatelic libraries. Members 'Sales and Wants' are published with the journal without charge.

Two auctions of members' material are held each year, one a postal auction and the other live at the weekend gathering. Other material surplus to members' requirements is available through a popular circulating packet, limited because of insurance constraints to subscribers within the UK.

The manager was Roberts himself, and the essay would have been produced at this time in support of the project. Unfortunately the estimate of £10,021.16s.6d. was judged too great at a Council meeting held in April 1936 and plans for restoration were shelved. Although sinking the vessel was considered the next option, she was later towed out and beached at Sparrow Cove until her rescue and return to Bristol in 1970. You may be sure we shall do our best to uphold the honour of old England in the far north.*" Jackson later publically expressed his gratitude to Cooke for his assistance in the purchase of furs and a pre-tested log-hut for the expedition. On 17 June there had occurred the surprise arrival of Fridtjof Nansen and a sole companion from the "*Fram*", Hjalmar Johansen, who had attempted a failed dash to the Pole and only by good fortune stumbled upon Jacksons' field headquarters, "*Elmwood*" on Northbrook Island. Nansen and Johansen subsequently returned to Norway on Jackson's ship "*Windward*" whilst Jackson remained in the Arctic for a further year. On July 26 the "*Windward*" had arrived, departing on Aug. 7 with Nansen, Johansen and covers including this item aboard, reaching Vardø in northern Norway on Aug. 13 from where telegrams were sent informing the world of Nansen's safe return, before the "*Windward*" carried on to London, arriving on Sept. 3. Quotations of catalogue numbers and values are taken from Stanley Gibbons catalogues, and other catalogues named in the text, current at the time of lotting. This auction contains many items that are unique or of exceptional rarity. It should be noted that all philatelic items are graded and described in relation to their condition as normally found. Covers in particular should be expected to have minor imperfections consistent with their age and passage through the postal system and only significant faults will be described. The condition of covers will not be considered as grounds for return.

The illustration of a lot in the catalogue or on the internet is deemed to form part of its description and lots may not be rejected on the grounds of imperfections that are visible clearly from the illustration.

The French Postal Agency in the Seychelles

Until September 1864, communications between the small French colonies in the Indian Ocean and France were difficult and very slow. No regular shipping service existed—letters were carried by whatever ship called, and posted when and where possible. As early as 1862, merchants at Mayotte tried sending mail privately to Seychelles for posting at the British Post Office there, to save time versus carriage to Reunion or Zanzibar.

In September 1864, the French Messageries Impériales began scheduled monthly service between Suez and Mauritius, stopping at Aden, Seychelles, and Reunion. This service was the key to the French colonial mails. Charles Édouard Dominjod was the Compagnie des Messageries Impériales shipping agent in Mahe, Seychelles. In 1864 he was approached by officials of Mayotte to act as a transit agent for French mails, and he accepted. In early 1865, an employment contract was signed, creating a French Postal Agency at Mahe, with Dominjod as Postmaster. His duties included collecting mails from the smaller French Indian Ocean colonies (Mayotte, Moheli, Grand Comoro, Anjouan, Nossi-Bé, Diego Suarez, and Ste Marie de Madagascar) and arranging carriage by French ships to Marseilles, as well as receiving mails from Marseilles and arranging carriage to those colonies. His annual salary was set at FF1200. An English translation of the full text of his contract is as follows:

Mayotte and Dependencies

Decree

We, the senior commander of Mayotte and Dependencies,

In view of the ministerial dispatch of 22 August 1864, no. 90, prescribing the establishment at Mahé (Seychelles) of an intermediary agency for postal correspondence between France and Mayotte, and the latter colony with Reunion;

Considering that the recommended creation is advantageous in all respects to the establishments of Mayotte and Dependencies;

In view of the letter, dated 28 February 1865, of M. Domingod [sic], agent of the Compagnie Française des Messageries Impériales at Mahé (Seychelles) indicating his acceptance of the proposals made to him by the higher administration at Mayotte to fulfill the duties of intermediary postal agent at the said location of Mahé;

In view of Article 4852 of the Organic Order of 7 September 1840 made applicable to Mayotte and Dependencies

On the proposal of the officer authorized to disburse funds, carrying out the duties of Director of the Interior

The advice of the administration having been heard

We have decreed and do decree the following:

M. Domingod, agent of the Compagnie des Messageries Impériales at Mahé (Seychelles) is named intermediary postal agent of the administration of Mayotte and Dependencies.

M. Domingod is charged with sending on the paquebots of the said company, whether destined for France or destined for Bourbon, the letters and packages of correspondence that shall be handed over to him by the captains and commanders of French government vessels to whom these packages shall have been entrusted by the administration of Mayotte and Nossi-Bé. He shall, in addition, take from the said paquebots all the correspondence addressed to the said establishments and give it to these same captains and commanders who are charged with delivering it to Mayotte.

In the case where letters and packages should be delivered to Seychelles by vessels other than the paquebots of the Messageries Impériales and should be destined for Mayotte and Nossi-Bé, they should likewise be carried to these colonies either by the opportunity of vessels charged with correspondence, or by any other opportunity that presents safeguards, in default of the former.

It shall be the same for letters and packages received at Seychelles from persons living in the locality.

M. Domingod shall receive an annual salary of 1,200 francs to be paid out of the local budget and beginning 1 April 1865.

Until this expense is assigned a special classification, it shall be treated under Chapter 4, Matériel, Article 3, Various expenses (extraordinary and unanticipated expenses).

The officer authorized to disburse funds is charged with the execution of the present decree, which shall be registered everywhere necessary, and deposited in the Colonial Council.

Note that, throughout the preceding document, the intermediary postal agent's name is given as "*Domingod*," although in all other documents, and in his own correspondence, it is given as "*Dominjod*."

This French Postal Agency existed without the consent of the British authorities, either in Seychelles or in London. In 1866, an attempt was made to regularize this arrangement. The following extract is the complete text of a letter sent in August 1866 regarding the status of *Dominjod* (here incorrectly spelled "*Domenjod*") and the Agency:

Ministry of Foreign Affairs

Office of Consulates and Business Affairs

[dateline] Paris August 10, 1866

My dear friend,

Pardon me for having taken so long to respond to you on the subject of M. Domenjod [sic]: All this week I have not had five minutes in succession at my disposal outside of service matters.

The French Consul at Port-Louis (Ile Maurice) did in fact send a very formal proposal to the Ministry regarding the establishment of a consular office at Mahé des Séchelles and the nomination of M. Domenjod to this post.

The Department had no objection, but, because the place where the new office was to be established is a British possession, it was necessary, according to custom, to communicate the proposal to London. And that is where the stumbling-block occurred: The English government made it known that it would not favor the nomination of M. Domenjod, whose unbending character caused concerns that he would not have good relations with the local authorities. Faced with this objection, the French government, which had no strong reason to pursue the establishment of a consular office at Mahé des Séchelles, did not insist, and I believe that there is no point in trying to go back over this matter. I am sorry for the negative result, since you take a personal interest in M. Domenjod.

Covers sent by this service can easily be distinguished. Mails from the (British) Seychelles Post Office were marked with various devices aboard the French ships, always stating "Poss An" or "Poss Ang" (Possession Anglaise). The postmarks were dated the day the ship left Seychelles (although exceptions and errors of dates are also known). Covers through the French Postal Agency were cancelled with markings reading "Col Fr" (Colonie Française). Generally, they were cancelled the date the ship sailed, so a "Col Fr" marking dated at the Seychelles must be from this office.

About twelve covers are known which were posted from Mahé through this Agency. Most were sent at the 6 décime 'unpaid' rate, the same charged for any unpaid cover put in the French mails in the Indian Ocean. There are two exceptions, prepaid with French stamps. While most of the known covers posted at this Agency originated with *Dominjod* or were sent on Messageries Impériales business, at least three other individuals are known to have used the agency for letters originating at Mahé.

No covers have as yet been identified which originated at Mayotte or its dependencies and were posted at Mahé through this Agency; they should exist, but have not, as of this writing, been recognized. One cover is known which originated at Mayotte and was sent privately to Seychelles for posting through the British Post Office before the French Agency opened. A number of covers are known from these places that were carried to other French (or British) colonies for posting before 1865.

The French Postal Agency at Seychelles was closed by British demand, early in 1870. Several correspondences that had taken advantage of this Agency continued, using the British mails through the Seychelles Post Office.

The Cordier Correspondence

Dominjod and his wife Aimée carried on a lengthy correspondence with her sister, Mme. Cordier, and her sister's husband Louis, posting many of these letters through this office. A total of about twenty covers (and some additional letters) are known from this correspondence. Not all of them were posted through the French Agency at Seychelles. The earliest covers in his correspondence predate the office, and were sent by other methods; the last few were sent by British mails after the Agency closed.

The earliest dated cover in this correspondence was sent in August 1864, franked with two Mauritius stamps, 1s. orange, and 4d. red [lot 1420]. It was carried privately to some other port (Bombay? Aden?), where the Mauritius stamps were not accepted. Rated 18d due, and with boxed India Unpaid marking, it bears a Pos An V Suez Paq F octagon on reverse dated 15 Dec. 1864 with Paris arrival mark of 16 Dec. The earliest cover to be posted through the new French Agency is postmarked 19 Jan. 1865 [lot 1421].

Four covers are known franked with French stamps. One is an 1868 cover prepaid at the 5 décime (50c.) rate [lot 1426], postage paid by two 20c. and one 10c. of the Laureate issue of France, applied by the sender and cancelled at Seychelles (carried by the *Emirne* sailing on 24 Nov. 1868). Another was sent at the 2 décime (20c.) military concessionary rate, prepaid by the Laureate issue stamp [lot 1427]. These four covers represent the only recorded usages of French stamps at Seychelles.

The French Postal Agency was terminated early in 1870. The first cover of this correspondence after that closure used the British Post Office at Seychelles, paying the 8d rate with two Mauritius stamps (6d. and 2d.), postmarked at Seychelles July 6 1870 [lot 1429].

It is also noteworthy that three of the four known examples of the straight-line REGISTERED mark of the Seychelles come from this correspondence, one paid 16d. (1s. 4d.) in cash, the second franked with two Mauritius stamps (1s. blue, 4d. red) and postmarked Seychelles/B/OC24/71 [lot 1431], and the third a large piece bearing a Mauritius 4d (the right one-third, presumably bearing a 1s. stamp, having been cut off) postmarked Seychelles/B/JA 15/73 [lot 1433].

Charles Édouard Dominjod, was the youngest son of François Louis Dominjod and Charlotte Anne Jeanne Violette. He was a former sea captain, born in St. Denis, Réunion on 14 June 1802 and died on 28 Jan. 1873 in Mahé, Seychelles.

He married **Aimée Marie Jacqueline D'Espagne** in St. Denis on 13 Nov. 1839 and together they had eight children:

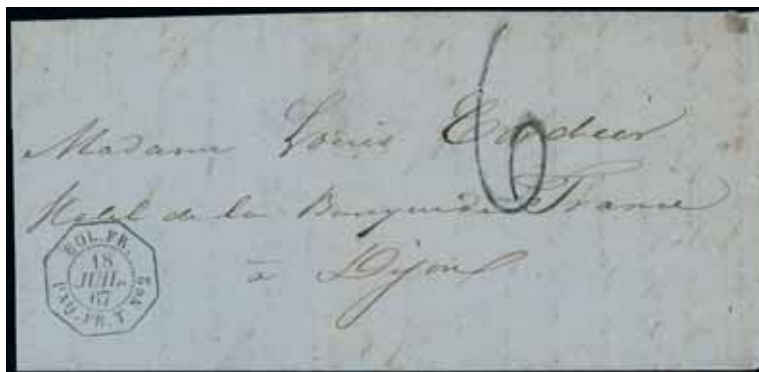

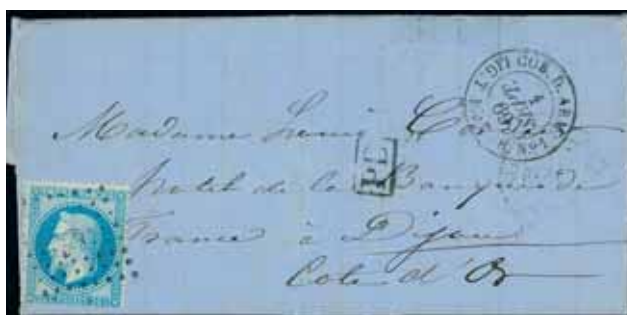

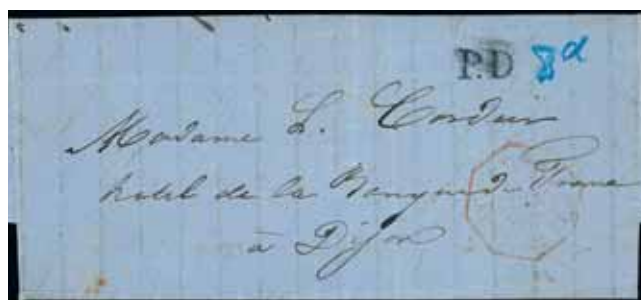
