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The Stefan Heijtz, FRPSL, International Gold Medal Collection of Barbados Postal History, Part One

Stefan Falkland Heijtz is a professional philatelist with a history of numerous and varied achievements during his long philatelic career. He is recognised internationally as the leading specialist in Falkland Islands philately as well as the author, publisher and editor of the unique specialised catalogue The Specialised Stamp Catalogue of the Falkland Islands and Dependencies, first issued in 1988 and currently in its seventh edition (released in 2020). He has written extensively on many subjects, and in several languages, in stamp magazines published around the world; and he shares his expertise as a consultant to the expert committees of the Royal Philatelic Society London, the British Philatelic Association (England) and the Philatelic Foundation (New York), as well as operating his own expertising service.



At the age of four, Stefan, the son of a stamp collecting father, started to collect stamps in his own right and at an early stage became interested in the stamps of the British Empire. When he was just thirteen, after the purchase of a substantial collection of Falkland Islands stamps at a local auction in Stockholm, he began a correspondence with the Postmaster on the islands. The collection grew, developing into the foremost collection of the postal history of the Falkland Islands and Dependencies ever created and containing most of the area's important and unique items. It was exhibited internationally many times achieving Gold and Large Gold Medals, as well as an International Grand Prix award. It was the first Falkland Islands exhibit ever to be awarded an international Gold.

In 1980 Stefan and his brother started a stamp company, Nova Stamps, which held more than 120 auctions before the auction business of the company was sold in 2008 to a larger company in Sweden. The sale of the auction business enabled Stefan to semi-retire at the age of 48. The auctions of Nova Stamps were fully computerised from its beginning in 1980, years ahead of its competitors, the entire software system having been created and developed by Stefan, who is also a computer engineer.

Stefan has formed a number of major collections of unrivalled status. Of particular note are the following: BARBADOS Postal History 1656–1881; REGISTERED LETTER STAMPS OF CANADA 1875–1893; FAROE ISLANDS 1790–1950 Postal History; NEW YORK POSTMASTER'S PROVISIONAL 1845–1847; PUERTO RICO Postal History 1778–1900; OFFICIAL STAMPS OF SPAIN 1854–1866; THE SWEDISH SOUTH POLAR EXPEDITION 1901–1903; and ST HELENA 1677–1937 Postal History.

Apart from building stamp collections, Stefan has also been, and still is, a highly active figure in postal and philatelic matters in diverse areas. For two seasons (1991–92, 1992–93) he was appointed Postal Officer and Postmaster of the former Falkland Islands Dependencies (now British Antarctic Territory) and was based sometimes at the Falkland Islands Post Office but mostly on board one of the two British Antarctic Survey icebreakers (RRS James Clark Ross and RRS Bransfield), visiting all the British bases in Antarctica as well as South Georgia. In 2002 he was Swedish Deputy Postmaster on Snow Hill Island, Antarctica, when the first ever Swedish Post Office in the Antarctic was opened.

In 1994, and again in 1998, he was a British Executive Service Overseas (BESO) advisor to the postal administrations and philatelic bureaux of Montserrat and Anguilla. These assignments occasioned visits to Barbados, Antigua and St Martin as well as a number of other islands in the West Indies.

During 2014 Stefan acquired the oldest remaining post office building in the Falklands, the Old Post Office House at Fox Bay. Over the past years this historic building has been fully restored, with the rooms that previously functioned as the settlement's post office converted into the Post Office Museum of the Falkland Islands. This Museum was honoured with a visit by Princess Anne in 2016.

Stefan's exceptional collection of Barbados, the first part of which is here presented, has been awarded three international Gold medals: Philakorea 2002 with Felicitations of the Jury for research, London 2010 and London 2022, as well as receiving the Prix d'Honneur and Harmers Diamond Jubilee Trophy in the International Class at Autumn Stampex 2000.





- The Red Crown Mark, 1828 entire to Christian Gottlieb Hüffel in Germany addressed "To the care of the/Revd. C.F. La Trobe" in London for onward transmision, charged "2/2" deleted in ms. and by Red Crown, altered to "4/4", being double packet rate, backstamped "BARBADOES/SP25/1828" fleuron despatch and red Nov. 19 arrival. Use of the Crown has been observed to validate alteration of a postal charge, especially to recharge letters first charged at single rate but subsequently reassessed as double rate. Noted composer and artist Christian Ignatius Latrobe (1758-1836) served also as clergyman and missionary for the Moravian Church. In March 1827 Christian Gottlieb Hüffel (1762-1842), Bishop of the 'Unitas Fratrum' Moravian Church, had made an extended tour of the Church's West Indies mission stations, including Mount Tabor in Barbados, in his capacity as a representative of the Mission Department, returning via London toward the end of that year. 





Jonathan Smalley (1948–2021)



The death of Jonathan Smalley, Chairman of the East Africa Study Circle, in November 2021 not only caused great sadness to study circle members but came as a big shock to all those who had had the great pleasure of knowing him over many years, whether in London at EASC meetings, at events such as Midpex where he often represented the EASC, or when he spoke at local societies.

East Africa was virtually 'home territory' to Jonathan, who was born in Malvern but spent his boyhood in upcountry Kenya where he became a fluent Swahili speaker. He would regularly remind friends that it was there that his interest in philately was sparked, and his enthusiasm for the area immediately infected anyone with whom he fell into discussion, particularly if the subject turned to the early postal history of BEA or Kenya postage dues. He was a superb and discerning collector, fitting every item he bought into the wider landscape of East African philately.

His understanding of this area was extensive, and his meticulous research of every cover he owned, bringing to bear upon it not just postal elements but aspects of social, political and genealogical history as well, was legendary. More recently he had built a large collection of covers and ephemera relating to the 1927 Gladstone flights and was writing a monograph on the subject when his final illness overtook him.

He had been a member of the EASC for some thirty years and was an active member of its committee, being Honorary Secretary from 2004 to 2011. In 2018 he was elected a member of the Royal Philatelic Society, and he became Chairman of the EASC in 2020, coinciding with London 2020 for which the study circle had many plans. But the pandemic led to its cancellation, and sadly Jonathan's death precluded him from presiding over the EASC's celebratory meeting during London 2022

Jonathan was also a musician, an accomplished genealogical researcher and a family man; but especially he was a friend to all who gathered regularly at the Union Jack Club. He was generous with his knowledge and clear-thinking but humble in his comments and analysis of others' gems and collections. A few were aware that for some time he had been suffering from an aggressive form of cancer, but he put up a courageous fight with a cheerful fortitude that was strengthened by his strong Christian faith. His courage greatly impressed those who were in touch with him in his final months. He will be remembered with much affection as a kind and loving man, and as a true servant not only of the EASC but of philately as a whole.




Tony A Gladstone

Founded by Captain Tony Gladstone in 1927, the Gladstone Airways service operated between Khartoum and Kisumu via Jinja. The De Havilland DH-50J "Pelican" was employed but suffered damage whilst taxi-ing at Khartoum before the first flight. The R.A.F. lent use of a Fairey III-D which in February and early March flew three flights from Khartoum to Kisumu, only the first of which carried mail, as well as two return flights. On the third return flight the aeroplane crashed and sank into Lake Victoria, the salvaged mail being subsequently forwarded by surface routing. The resulting hiatus in the service lasted until October when the repaired "Pelican" became once more available. No mail was carried on either leg of the first resumed flights but a second mail was carried on the Khartoum-Kisumu flight completed on October 17. However, on October 19 the "Pelican" crashed once more whilst on a test flight and the service ended.





THE FALKLAND ISLANDS PHILATELIC STUDY GROUP (founded 1970)

The Group was founded following a meeting of some 50 collectors gathered together by Malcolm Barton, our Past President. A weekend meeting takes place annually in March during which displays are given, auctions and a bourse take place and an Annual General Meeting is held. Regional meetings are also held on a regular basis in various parts of the UK and in other countries, including the USA, Norway, Sweden and

the Falkland Islands. Members, whether beginners or advanced collectors, are encouraged to attend.

The award winning Upland Goose, a quarterly journal, is distributed to all members and to leading philatelic libraries. Members 'Sales and Wants' are published with the journal without charge.

Two auctions of members' material are held each year, one a postal auction and the other live at the weekend gathering. Other material surplus to members' requirements is available through a popular circulating packet, limited because of insurance constraints to subscribers within the UK.



Colin Graham Booth FRPSL (1933–2021)



The philatelic world was shocked to learn of the passing of Graham Booth in December 2021. He died at home peacefully in his sleep, just eleven days after his 88th Birthday.

Graham was born on the Wirral in 1933 and retained a life-long affection for Liverpool and Lancashire, even calling his boat the Red Rose. His parents moved him between a range of schools in Lancashire before finally settling him at King George V Grammar School, where he did extremely well. He went on to be head boy and win a place to read economics at St John's College Cambridge, a subject he claimed was of no use to him in later life, though one suspects it may have assisted him in formulating principled arguments in support of whatever he was trying to achieve.

His business career started with Unilever. Next he was with Bowater Scott in the UK before moving to become President of Scott Taiwan and then running a major pulp and paper subsidiary in Mexico, where at one point he was responsible for some 10,000 staff. A very busy and peripatetic life. He married twice, the first marriage produced two sons, Paul and Simon, to whom he may have been closest in his later years. He had three grandchildren, Matt, Beth and Ella. Although he was long separated from his wife Cath, who lives in Spain, they remained good friends.

Upon retirement from his work in Mexico he moved to the Cayman Islands, where he spent time enjoying his boat, rediscovering philately, and exploring a love of history, which he often felt he should have read instead of economics.

Graham returned to the UK in 2003, having, as he put it, 'realised the limitations of permanent sun, sand and water', which must be true as he retired to a wonderful penthouse apartment in Worthing where the beach is stony! He became an enthusiastic participator in many philatelic societies, achieving prominent roles locally in Sussex, becoming a fellow of both the Society of Postal Historians and the Royal Philatelic Society London, and rising to be President of the British West Indies Study Circle.


He first started exhibiting in 2004. Being competitive by nature he soon realised the joy philately offers compared to other collecting hobbies in that not only can you show your treasures off but you can win things. Graham won the best first-time entry in that show and went on to produce several gold medal exhibits, culminating in a number of large golds in recent years, including two at Stockholmia 2019 in celebration of the Royal Philatelic Society London's sesquicentenary – one for 'The Rise and Fall of the American Merchant Marine as a Trans Atlantic Mail Carrier, 1800–1868' and one for 'Anglo-Australian Mail, 1840–1860: The Transfer from Sail to Steam'. He was well known too for his range of one-frame exhibits, generally on a maritime theme.

Graham will be much missed.

1914 Battle of the Falkland Islands - The Graham Booth FRPSL Collection

Palkland Islands, 28 November, 1914. It was indeed pleasant to receive your letter of 25th Septr on 10th November, and to hear your news. One would have thought that at this outpost of Empire one would have been in no immediate danger of the Teuton, but to one like yourself with a persoanl knowledge of South America it is well known that the South American Republics are simply honeycombed with Gerns and that they have a very large interestein Brazil, Argentina, and Chile. For instance in the province of Rio Grande do Sul there are no less than 500,000 Germans, while on the West Coast whole townships are Cerran. As a cons in trouble from the start; by wireless we heard of filibustering expeditions in our immediate vicinity, steamers with reservists on board varying from 400 to 1000 hung round us for days, then a cruiser paid us a visit at night, but, providentially, mistook a blue light for a search light, and, thinking a warship was in port, cleared out. Yes, we have had quite an exciting time, and as Generalissimo I have much responsibility and worry. The Colonists have turned up splendidly and we have several hundred Volunteera. Then later we had our own equadron here under Admiral Cradock. I saw a good deal of him, and we became great, indeed intimate, friends. Poor fellow, he was I fear given an impossible task with the material at his disposal. The r action off Coronel was most disastrous resulting in the loss of the 'Good Hope' and the 'Montouth' and every soul on boardit A terrible business. The heavy sea interfered with the firing of our lower deck guns , but in any case the 'Scho her sister ship the 'Oneisenau' were armoured cruisers and much more powerful than anything opposed to them. As soon as action took place on the Ist) I expected an immediate raid on

the 'Good Hope' I was so satisfied of the danger the Colony ran s the extreme probability of the Germans evading Cradock's ships as their average spred was about 6 knots faster than that of our vessels, and paying us a visit as they proceeded north to the principal trade route, that I had advised all Heads of Households to send away their women and children to the Comps. -bis advice was acted upon, the barbarities which had been committed by the modern wuns in Belgium acting as an additional incentive. The Home Authorities likewise warned me to expect a raid; as a matter of fact I had already forestalled their instructions and done more than they suggested. The only thing to do after that was to overhaul one's preparations, and await the result. At the height of the crisis a guard ship arrived to assist our defence, and we are now in a very much stronger position than formerly. From the 4th to the 24th I never got to bed, but lay on a sofa in the room off the Office so as to be near the telephone and in touch withthe wireless station which kept us very busy with cypher and other messages. So you see the quiet easy-going domesticate'd Falklands has been upheaved. We have become a grave-dissing community, and many household Gods have been put underground. Immediately after the 'burying' there was a perfect bliggard of snow which afterwards turned to heavy rain three inches fell and when the contents of the boxes were again brought to the surface I doubt whether the attentions of the cern could have produced any more disastrous results!! I have had many valuables articles and Emmiss destroyed, but after all is it not the Fortunes of War? ot is just as well to be philosophical at the present juncture, and put the best face on everything. Pesides I see the humour of it all, which you will I am sure admit to be helpful. We are not out of the wood yet by any means, and we may yet have to defend our shores, but this we are prepared to do to the best of our ability. I am glad to say that my wife and daughtersare not here.I r-alized the danger some considerable time ago and telegraphed to





- SMS Cormoran, Envelope noted "Feldpostbrief" to Worms, endorsed from the Cormoran on reverse, with two light strikes of Marine Schiffspost No. 8 "1 3/15" c.d.s., resealed by U.S. censor label and with "Auslandstelle Emmerich/Frei-/gegehen" cachet in violet. Also unused photographic card of the Russian officers of the Ryazan being transferred to the Emden after their capture. SMS "Cormoran" was originally a Russian merchant vessel named "Ryazan". Captured by SMS "Emden" on Aug. 4 1914 she was converted into a raider at Kiautschou but forced to later seek port at Apra Harbour in Guam. The United States, then neutral, refused to supply provisions sufficient for Cormoran to make a German port and after the U.S. declaration of war on Apr. 6, 1917, the Naval Governor of Guam informed "Cormoran" that she would be seized as a hostile combatant, prompting her crew to scuttle her. In the resulting action seven members of the crew were killed, the others taken into custody as prisoners of war. UNILATERAL DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE, The 1966 Act of Ratification of the 1965 Constitution of Rhodesia, large document (760mm x 610mm) signed by 35 Honourable Members of the Parliament of Rhodesia, framed and glazed, trivial imperfections. The document presented to back bencher members of the Government Party in recognition of their "equal but separate and decisive role resulting in the Declaration on the 11th day of November mcmlxv, of the Sovereign Independence of Rhodesia". An important historic document, the number created and presented by the Government understood to have been limited to the signatories alone in gratitude for their essential role at the "Proceedings of the Parliament of Rhodesia of the 18th day of February, 1966, evidencing our vote which rendered it possible to ratify by the requisite majority exceeding two-thirds of the total membership of Parliament the Constitution of Rhodesia as an Independent Sovereign State." This historic document was presented to signatory Theodore Ellison (1922-1985), representative for Salisbury Central and a founding member of the ruling Rhodesian Front. Photo.

No agreement on terms of independence could be reached between the British and Rhodesian Governments and in a broadcast to the nation on 11th November 1965, Prime Minister Ian Smith declared Rhodesia's independence and announced a new Constitution, closely based upon the 1961 Constitution but without any elements of subordination to Britain. When the Rhodesian Parliament met shortly afterwards on the 25th November, the Speaker ruled that the 1965 Constitution was valid and by the Constitution (Ratification) Act (No. 1 of 1966), it was confirmed by the two-thirds majority.

Rhodesian 'UDI' was the first unilateral break from the United Kingdom by one of its colonies since the Declaration of Independence by the United States in 1776. The UK, the Commonwealth and United Nations all deemed the declaration illegal, and economic sanctions, the first in the history of the UN, were imposed on the breakaway colony. Despite near-complete international isolation, Rhodesia continued as an unrecognised state, declaring itself to be a republic in 1970 in an unsuccessful attempt to win foreign recognition. The following Bush War between the government and rival communist-backed black Rhodesian groups continued until UDI was revoked as part of the Lancaster House Agreement in December 1979, leading to full independence under the name Zimbabwe in 1980.






